<ul> <li>3/4 cup small birdseed</li> <li>1 packet of unflavored gelatin</li> <li>1/4 cup water</li> <li>Cookie Cutters</li> <li>Parchment Paper</li> <li>Straw</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Twine</li> <li>Bird Seed Cookie</li> <li>Camera</li> <li>Decoration Supplies (color pencils, markers, painting, etc.)</li> <li>Paper</li> </ul>

<ol> <li>Boil water over medium heat.</li> <li>Add in packet of unflavored gelatin.Stir until gelatin is dissolved (I-2 mins).</li> <li>Take gelatin off heat and let set for a couple of minutes. Mix with bird seed.</li> <li>Place cookie cutters on a piece of parchment paper.Scoop the bird seed into cookie cutters, and using another piece of parchment paper, press the birdseed down.</li> <li>Stick a straw in the top of each filled cookie cutter to create a small hole.</li> <li>Set cookie cutters in the freezer for 20 minutes.Remove cookie cutters from the freezer, and let them sit in room temperature for approximately 10 minutes.</li> <li>Carefully push the bird seed feeders out of the cookie cutters.</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Thread a piece of twine through the hole at the top of the bird seed feeder and tie it into a loop.</li> <li>Place a Bird Seed Cookie in an easy to view location in your yard</li> <li>Take photos of the birds who visit your yard</li> <li>Pick out your favorite photo and draw a picture to send to family and friends</li> </ol>
